Language Art Activities:

Read the book once. Then reread the book using a stuffed animal tiger to demonstrate different actions such as petting Tiger's nose and tummy. The teacher may ask for volunteers to perform the tasks.

Focus on retelling the story and focusing on the sequence of the story. Write out three story strips that include:

Tiger had a surprise party.

Tiger is asleep.

Tiger starts waking up.

Ask the children what happens first, in the middle and at the end. If needed ask questions about the setting or main characters to help them decide how to put the story strips in order.

The teacher may also use as book such as *Goldilocks and the Three Bears* by James Marshall to demonstrate the storymap idea. Children may be asked to create a storymap of the story or the teacher may create it with the whole group.
